Holy Cow! The start of the 2013-14 school year is just around the corner. I have enjoyed seeing our kids trickle back into and around the school for all the camps and summer activities. I love having kids in the building again. It gets me real excited for the start of the 2013-14 school year. This summer has been a very busy summer here at the "FORT" and the custodial staff is finishing preparing the buildings for the upcoming year.

The biggest news around here is the proposed building project at the Secondary building. At the July board meeting the board unanimously passed a resolution that calls for a Special Election on September 10, 2013 for a remodel and addition to the Jr. Sr. High building. The cost of the project is not to exceed \$12,930,000. The building plan for this project was developed by a community group of between 50 and 60 people who met five times over the past several months to help evaluate the district's needs and to help formulate possible solutions to the issues. The District then held 3 additional public meetings to receive community feedback. After all the meetings the board took the proposed plan recommended by the committee and passed the resolution to move forward with the election in September. #### In other news:

The School District will be launching a new website for the start of the school. The website will have a new design to it which reflects our innovative approach to education. We have also worked to make the website more user-friendly and have set procedures in place to keep the website updated on a regular basis. Programming, facilities, and all other aspects of educating our kids here at the "FORT" are evaluated and goals are pulled from them these areas for the upcoming school year. These goals will be refined and presented to the Board at the August Board meeting for approval. Our District is very fortunate to have an outstanding group of people who serve on our Board and their efforts are very much appreciated.

Ages 2 through 5 years enrolled in a school based program not licensed as a child care provider	<ul> <li>4 doses of DTaP, DTP, or DT vaccine,</li> <li>3 doses of Polio vaccine,</li> <li>3 doses of Hib vaccine or 1 dose of Hib given at or after 15 months of age, *Hib not required after child reaches 5 yrs of age</li> <li>3 doses of pediatric Hepatitis B vaccine,</li> <li>1 dose of MMR or MMRV given on or after 12 months of age,</li> <li>1 dose of varicella (chickenpox) or MMRV given on or after 12 months of age, written documentation (including year) of varicella disease from parent, guardian, or health care provider will be accepted.</li> <li>4 doses of pneumococcal or 1 dose of pneumococcal given on or after 15 months of age.</li> </ul>
Students from Kindergarten through 12 <sup>th</sup> Grade, including all transfer students from outside the State of Nebraska and any foreign students	<ul> <li>3 doses of DTaP, DTP, DT, or Td vaccine, one given on or after the 4<sup>th</sup> birthday,</li> <li>3 doses of Polio vaccine,</li> <li>3 doses of pediatric Hepatitis B vaccine or 2 doses of adolescent vaccine if student is 11-15 years of age.</li> <li>2 doses of MMR or MMRV vaccine, given on or after 12 months of age and separated by at least one month,</li> <li>2 doses from parent, guardian, or health care provider will be accepted. If the child has had varicella disease, they do not need any varicella shots.</li> </ul>
Additionally, <b>for 7<sup>th</sup> Grade</b> Only	1 dose of Tdap (must contain Pertussis booster)
